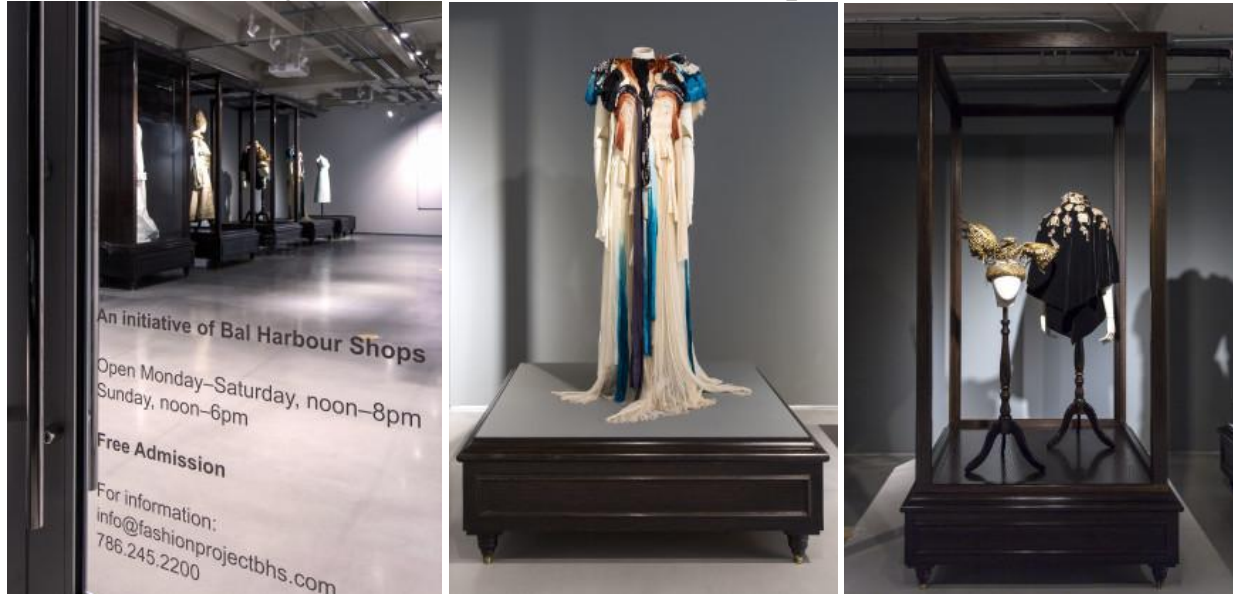




## Just Looking
